



## *Sugar Creek Rules for guests & visitors*

- 1) Please keep in mind that this is not a public campground. It is a non-profit ministry site that serves a few thousand people each year. We ask that the site, facilities and staff be respected. Sugar Creek is a wonderful environment for the Pentathlon and we want to maintain a good relationship with them, so we ask that parents please follow all of Sugar Creek's rules.
- 2) If you have not paid to rent one of the buildings or cabins we ask that you refrain from entering them.
- 3) Please do not use the laundry facilities. Do not enter the pond or pool.
- 4) Do not enter any of the pastures or stable areas; feeding the animals (horses, mules, and llamas) is not permitted.
- 5) Please clean up after yourself. Sugar Creek has a small staff with a large site to manage.
- 6) Fires may only be lit in a pre-existing campfire ring. All fires must be COMPLETELY extinguished before leaving the fire site. Firewood is provided upon request.
- 7) **No Pets.**
- 8) Severe weather shelters are the shower building, the Koinonia Lodge, and the Manna Center.
- 9) If anything does happen or things get damaged please let the Sugar Creek staff or PRWS Coordinators know immediately. Sugar Creek Bible Camp 608-734-3113
- 10) Drive only on gravel or paved roads. Please do not enter anywhere that is marked off. (They are trying to grow some grass in some spots.)

**PARKING:** Parking for day visitors and for parents staying at Sugar Creek will be in the parking lot located at the Manna Center. There is limited parking for those staying at the Koinonia Lodge. Follow the main entrance road and look for signs directing you to the parking area. School vehicles can be driven to the campsites to drop off gear then returned to one of the lots. Exception: One car per school may park on gravel near your site if you are in the Frontier Village. Schools staying in the Seeker and Settler Villages may also leave one car at the Frontier Village for convenience if desired. This vehicle must remain at the site for the duration of the Pentathlon and may not be driven back and forth through the campground.

### **NOTES FOR PARENTS (non-chaperones) STAYING AT SUGAR CREEK**

- 1) Please do not encourage your children to share your sleeping accommodations but allow them to remain with their class and the whole group. The camping villages are for the sole use of the Pentathletes from your school. Please do not allow family members or friends of the athletes to enter the cabins.
- 2) For safety reasons we ask that non-chaperone parents leave the children's camping/cabin areas before dark so that there is no confusion about unknown adults. If there is a need for extra parental help or another reason a parent must remain after dark, please identify yourself to one of the coordinators by contacting **Alycann pronounced (Alice Ann) Taylor** 608-632-3527. Cell phone reception is spotty at Sugar Creek, so you may have to track her down in person; she is staying overnight in a cabin Frontier Village.
